With the help of God, I will.

Have you ever tried to keep a promise? It might be something small like keeping a nice surprise from someone for a few days or it could be something serious like when a husband and wife exchange their marriage vows for life.

I have been thinking about promises this week when meeting with several baptism families where I go through the service with them and explain to the parents and Godparents the promises they are making to God and to their child and God child. I love the responses they have to make from the service book as they say in response to the questions asked "with the help of God I will." This response is echoed in an ordination service where the candidate being ordained deacon or priest says in response to the promises they are being asked to make "By the help of God, I will."

"'With' or 'by' the help of God, I will" is such a poignant reminder that we cannot keep any promise easily by ourselves – but rather we need God's help and grace to live out any promises we make to him. Michael will be making his promises again as he is ordained Priest this summer. I made the same promises 10 years ago as I was ordained Deacon. We still both need God's help to keep any of the promises we made at ordination and we all need God's help to fulfil the things he calls us to do and in order to become the people he calls us to be.

We were not designed to do life by ourselves – so if you need help – just ask God and think 'by the help of God, I will – as he longs to hear and answer our prayers much more than our willingness to ask!

Rest and Be Thankful Chocolate Cake

Taken from "Cakes, Bakes, Puddings and Prayers" by Susan Over which contains mouthwatering recipes accompanied by meditations.

Ingredients

150g (5oz) self-raising Flour 75g (3 oz) drinking chocolate 175g (6oz) castor sugar 175g (6oz) butter or marg -room temperature 3 large eggs 3 tablespoons boiling water

Method

Preheat oven to gas mark 4/180 degrees C/ 350 degrees F. Grease and line a 20cm (8in) round cake tin.

Sift flour and drinking chocolate into a large mixing bowl.

Add all other ingredients and blend together. Beat for a couple of minutes until smooth.


Turn into tin and bake for about 45-60 minutes until a fine skewer inserted in the middle comes out clean.

Leave in tin for a few minutes, then cool on wire rack.

Ice with your favourite icing or melted chocolate.

To make chocolate fudge icing, put 110g (4oz) granulated sugar and 115ml (4 fl oz) milk into a pan, Simmer for 9 minutes, then add 150g (5oz) plain chocolate, 50g (2oz) butter and 2 tablespoons double cream. Leave to cool and then spread over the cake.
