Sharon's Farewell Letter

Many of you who read this magazine will know by now that January 2021 sees me relocate full time into my hospital chaplaincy role at University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire & Rugby St Cross with a particular focus being on working with people living with long-term respiratory conditions, people who have a palliative diagnosis and bereaved people. This will see me relocating from my part time curacy role in Nuneaton to working specifically in Coventry and Rugby.

Whilst I am really sad to be moving on from so many wonderful people in the community here in Hartshill and in Galley Common, I am very much looking forward to what God has in store for me in my new places of ministry both in the hospitals and out in the community.

For me, it feels fitting to be heading into this full-time role at the beginning of a new year and one of the things I have enjoyed doing on occasions in the past is to rededicate my life to God afresh using the Methodist Covenant Prayer.

The Methodist Church website says this about the Covenant Prayer:

"The traditional Covenant prayer makes it very clear that this affirmation is a serious one that embraces the whole of our life, in all its parts. Most people find it quite tough to say, and really mean it. But the prayer is so central to the Christian life that other Churches have also adopted it.

In our culture we tend to prize our ability to make decisions and choose our own path in life. It can feel very hard to give that up. But this prayer is like a love poem. It is about surrendering to God in love and joy."

This prayer, is indeed a prayer of full surrender to God and not a prayer to be said lightly but one that should be said with purposeful commitment,

trusting that God, Creator of all things, knows what he is doing and has a plan and purpose for each of us.

In the spirit of ecumenical working, of which hospital chaplaincies are, and in which I very much believe we should be engaging in more of in the future, pooling our gifts and resources; may I encourage you to rededicate your life to God in 2021 using this prayer, as I will be doing.

If you feel able to give yourselves afresh to God at the start of a new year that is full of so much more hope than all that we've all experienced during 2020, then who knows what amazing things you will do as you follow God's call on your life this coming year:

The Methodist Covenant Prayer

I am no longer my own but yours. Put me to what you will, rank me with whom you will; put me to doing, put me to suffering; let me be employed for you, or laid aside for you, exalted for you, or brought low for you; let me be full. let me be empty, let me have all things, let me have nothing: I freely and wholeheartedly yield all things to your pleasure and disposal. And now, glorious and blessed God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, you are mine and I am yours. So be it.

And the covenant now made on earth, let it be ratified in heaven.'

I pray that as we enter 2021 that each of you will experience and know God's blessings in your lives and in the lives of those you love this coming year, and that this community will reap the fruits of those blessings. Amen.

A reminder that face masks (face shields are not a suitable substitution) must be worn while in Church (the only exemption being the service leaders and preachers who can remove them temporarily to talk).

In line with Government restrictions for Tier 4, which we are in, those attending will not be able to interact with anyone outside a household or support bubble. Please do respect this while on Church premises.

We will continue to email out our virtual services for the Christmas services. If you know anyone who would like to receive our services by email, then please let Heather know.

The Churches' Premises outside services are closed to everyone and entry can only take place with the agreement of Heather or in her absence the Churchwardens – please do not attempt to access them with any keys that you may have.

We would ask for your prayers during what is going to be a difficult situation for our Churches, and also, we would love to hear of anyone who needs prayer during these difficult and worrying times.

Sharon's leaving Service

Sharon has now finished as our curate and has started a full-time role with University Hospital Coventry and Warwickshire Trust Chaplaincy and will be attached to the Rugby Deanery from 1st January 2021. Please hold Sharon in your prayers as she starts this new role.

3 Prayer themes for this month, **The Lord's Prayer** <u>Matthew 6:9-13</u>, **Fruits** of the Spirit Galatians 5:22-23 and the **Beatitudes** Matthew 5: 1-12

Theme 1 – The Lord's Prayer, Matthew 6:9-13

- 1st **Our Father** As we begin a new year, pray to the Father for a closer relationship with Him. With him all things are possible.
- 2nd Who art in heaven Though we cannot see Him, we know through faith that He is with us, guiding and protecting us. Pray today for all who need guidance and protection in these difficult times. Pray for God's protection for local businesses and organisations in our area that may be struggling.
- 3rd **Hallowed be thy name** Pray today for God's blessing on your families and friends. Only God can bestow these blessings through His infinite grace and mercy, but it is up to us to ask.
- 4th **Thy Kingdom come** Pray today for all those doing God's work for His kingdom here on earth. In these difficult COVID times, especially pray for our church leaders Heather and Sharon; our church wardens at Holy Trinity Hartshill and St Peters Galley Common; our lay readers and all who serve our parishes of Hartshill and Galley Common.
- 5th **Thy will be done** Pray for God's guidance to show you how to serve Him here on earth. *Matthew 7:7 "Ask and it will be given to you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you."*
- 6th- **On earth as it is in heaven Epiphany**. As the wise men sought and found the Christ child so must we seek Jesus in our lives. Pray for Him to reveal Himself to us and for us to reveal Him to others through our actions. Going the extra mile for God!

- 7th **Forgive us our trespasses** Pray today for anyone seeking forgiveness in their lives. Pray that they will be forgiven and shown God's mercy through His grace.
- 8^{th} **As we forgive those who trespass against us** 'Where there is injury your pardon Lord'. Help all those who have been harmed either physically or emotionally. Pray that they will find strength to forgive insult or injury, to be freed from the hold that others have inflicted.
- 9th **Lead us not into temptation** Help us to look inwardly and count our blessings. Pray that we will be thankful for all God's blessings in our lives. Help us to avoid those things which displease God. 'Seek ye first the kingdom of God and His righteousness, and all these things shall be given unto you, Alleluia '.
- 10th − **But deliver us from evil** − Pray today for anyone in need of deliverance from addictions that cause harm. Pray that God will stay close to you and that you will stay close to God. Put on your armour of God to help fight evil.
- 11th **For thine is the Kingdom** God's kingdom has no beginning, middle or end. Whenever we need Him all we need to do is pray and ask. Take time to pray today for those things on your own heart. Offer them to God and pray expectantly.
- 12th **The power and the glory** Pray today for the power of the Lord to guide all those in authority to make the right decisions for the future health and welfare of our nation and its people.
- 13th **Forever and ever, Amen** As we reach the end of the first theme for this month's prayers affirm our faith in God by saying the Diocesan prayer.

Father pour out your spirit upon us,

Grant us a new vision of your glory,

A new experience of your power,

A new faithfulness to your word, and

A new consecration to your service,

That your love may grow among us and your kingdom come, through Jesus Christ our lord, Amen

<u>Theme 2 – Fruits of the Spirit, Galatians 5:22-23</u>

- $14^{\rm th}$ Love . Love your neighbours as yourselves. Pray today for your neighbour's household.
- 15th **Joy.** The joy of a new baby. Pray today for all babies born in our parish. Pray for the fruits of the spirit for their parents, to help support them in the joyous but challenging world they now find themselves in.
- 16th **Peace.** Today's prayer, 'The peace of the Lord be always with you...... And also, with you'. Offer someone the peace of the Lord today.
- 17th **Patience.** Pray for patience in trying circumstances or when you feel frustrated. Walk a mile in another person's footsteps before judging them. God will work in His time for our good, trust all things in Him.
- 18th **Kindness.** Pray for the opportunity to demonstrate kindness to those who need it. Think of someone today who may need a kindness, a phone call to a lonely person, an encouraging word to someone discouraged, a helping hand to someone in need. The list is endless. Is there anyone on your heart today that would benefit from your kindness and see God in you?
- 19th **Goodness.** In our greatest times of need when we are ill, vulnerable and afraid, nurses and doctors are there to care for us. Pray today for all nurses, doctors and care workers. 'May I be the nurse or doctor Lord, with gentle healing hands. Who always speaks with kindness, who cares and understands. And while I'm serving others, as You would have me do. Please help me to remember that I'm truly serving you.' Anonymous

- 20th **Faithfulness.** Pray today for all key workers in our parish and the wider community. Pray for their protection as they go about their daily duties faithfully and diligently for the good of all.
- 21st **Gentleness.** *Proverbs 15 :1 'A gentle answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger'*. Pray today for the opportunity to demonstrate gentleness to others and ask for Gods guidance to calm any storm.
- 22^{nd} **Self-control.** In a world that can so easily provide us with excess and false idols, pray for self-control in all aspects of your life.

At the end of the second prayer theme, reflect on the fruits of the spirit and ask God for His help with any that you find difficult to apply in your lives.

<u>Theme 3 – Beatitudes, Matthew 5: 1-12</u>

- 23rd **Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven**. Instead of pride and personal independence, submit to God's spirit in prayer so that he will dwell in us totally and override our spirit completely. Pray today for all our Christian brothers and sisters both in our local communities and around the world. Pray that every Christian will lead one other person to God this year.
- 24th **Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account.** In the world of social media, pray for all children and teenagers in our local and wider community. Especially pray for young Christians who struggle with social norms. Pray that they will have the strength to overcome any personal difficulties where they feel unloved or worthless due to unkind comments and the actions of others because of their faith.
- 25th **Blessed are those who mourn, for they shall be comforted.** Pray today for all those who have sadly lost loved ones over the previous year, whether due to the pandemic or other reasons, loss is loss and the sting of death is still just as painful. Have faith that we will be reunited with them again one day in heaven.
- 26th **Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth.** Meekness is not a sign of weakness! To demonstrate humility in all circumstances can

not be achieved through personal nature but through Gods nature. Pray today for God to give you strength to demonstrate obedience to authority, show kindness when mistreated, to not seek revenge on others, show gentleness and every consideration for people both inside and outside of your circle. This takes unimaginable strength that can only come from God.

- 27th **Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they shall be satisfied.** Pray today for the homeless. Show compassion to those in our local community living on the streets with a kind word or a hot drink. Pray for all organisations that work tirelessly to shelter and protect the most vulnerable in our society. Ask God what you can do to support this vital work.
- 28th **Blessed are the merciful, for they shall receive mercy.** Pray today for anyone who has shown you any unkindness. Ask for God's grace upon them and forgive them for any hurt they have caused through unkind words or deeds. *Ephesians 4:32 'Be kind to one another, tender hearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.'*
- 29th **Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God**. Pray today for a pure heart. Ask God to cleanse us of any impurity, unthankfulness, unbelief and suspicions about others. Pray for a pure heart to see the good in others, show thankfulness for His blessings, and worship God with our whole heart.
- 30th **Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called sons of God.** Pray today for inner peace, peace in our local communities and, peace in the wider community.
- 31st **Blessed are those who are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.** Pray today for all Christians around the world who are persecuted for their faith. Pray for the courage to be bold and stand up for your faith and know that over the coming year God will bless you for all the good work you do.

In 2011, the desperate shortage of foster carers and adoptive parents in the UK made headline news and several Church leaders, who themselves were foster carers or adoptive parents, committed to work together to raise the profile of fostering and adoption within the UK Church.

The Home for Good initiative was launched in early 2013 as a campaign run in partnership between Care for the Family, Thirtyone:eight and Evangelical Alliance, with the aim of making fostering and adoption a significant part of the life and ministry of the Church in the UK. The Church was recognising the need for more people to foster or adopt and of the importance of supporting families that do this; so in September 2014 Home for Good became a charity.

Children and young people are of course at the heart of the charity and they are passionate about finding the best possible home for every child who needs one, especially for those who have waited the longest - a home where they will be loved and nurtured and go on to thrive. They believe in the potential of every child and young person and will not give up.

H for G is not an adoption agency so they do not assess prospective adopters, but they support those exploring adoption/fostering and go through the adoption process with them. They run campaigns to inspire people to consider fostering or adoption and offer help on a positive journey from the moment of inspiration to the point of placement.

H for G's Christian faith inspires, motivates and encourages them to act and believe that change is possible as they stand firmly on a strong theological foundation and commit to prayer for every aspect of their work. They are open about their faith and recognize the potential in the Church to make a difference, but are also keen to work in partnership with those of other faiths and none.

Christingle 2020

The Christingle Service in aid of the Children's Society is usually one of our very popular services, attended by many people from the church and community. As you know, we were unable to host this celebration this year. So a team from the church decided to organise Christingles that were given out in a 'take away' bag. Each bag contained everything needed to create a Christingle and was accompanied by instructions on how to make, the meaning of the different parts of the Christingle, prayers to say when lighting the candle and some news about the work of the Children's Society.





The Christingle Service went ahead.....just in another way!

Altogether we gave out 120 bags at Holy Trinity and 40 bags were distributed at St. Peter's Galley Common. In Heather's words: "It was great to be able to 'bless' the community in this way.....and it was lovely to see families walking through the village with their bags of light and hope."

We are able to send to the Children's Society a donation of over £200 which is due the generosity of people from both churches.

May I take this opportunity to thank all those who helped in any way.

Foodbank - what we can continue to do

Due to the restrictions of the volunteers / space at the local foodbank warehouse we are **still not able** to continue with the bringing of items to Church or deliveries to the warehouse. This is at a time when the Food Bank is still under huge pressure.

The Food Bank is still working with its volunteers and there are collection points in most supermarkets. If you are visiting a supermarket for your own shopping please consider adding a few items to donate in this way. A list of the most urgently required items can be found on the food bank website.

Please note, they are no longer able to accept infant formula milk or baby food due to a UNICEF directive.

This is a really valuable way we can collectively as Churches show our love to the vulnerable people in our society – especially as we are not able to support them with our usual collection of tinned/packet food.


Food Voucher Scheme for Hartshill

Covid 19 has brought great hardship to some families and individuals due to loss of jobs or loss of earnings. We know at this time some people will struggle. Food Banks will try and help those referred to them by Social Services and others however it likely that others will not receive the help they need.

Hartshill Parish Council have decided to sponsor a food voucher scheme (to be used in local shops) but need assistance in identifying families and individuals who need help. The local schools have been approached to help with identifying families but there may be other people who we may be aware of - neighbours or friends.

It is a sensitive area as people may be offended if asked but on the other hand, they may be so grateful for help. 

THREE KINGS

Does Christmas seem long gone? Well, Christmas doesn't really end until Twelfth Night, 6th January. In the past all the 12 days of Christmas used to be celebrated with feasting and parties. January 6th is also the Feast of the Epiphany, which is the day on which the wise men, led by the star, arrived at Bethlehem At Christmas we sang about Three Kings but we don't really know who they were, kings or wise men or where they came from - you can check the details in St Matthew's Gospel, chapter 2.



We do know that they brought very expensive symbolic gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh for Jesus, not the usual things that you would give to a small baby. Traditionally the gifts have a special meaning: gold is for a king; frankincense (sweet smelling incense) is for God and myrrh (a spice used to prepare bodies for burial) for mortal man.

Sharon's Recipe - Curried Lamb Soup

Serves 4



Ingredients

350g lamb leg steaks cut into small cubes 1 large onion, peeled and finely chopped 2 garlic gloves, peeled and crushed ½ tsp ground ginger 3 tbsp medium curry powder 400g tinned tomatoes, chopped 500 ml lamb stock 2 large carrots, peeled and cubed 110g spinach or kale Salt and freshly ground pepper

Method

- 1. In a large saucepan, heat it on a medium heat and add the lamb cubes, onion and garlic and stir with a wooden spoon to prevent the lamb sticking. Once it starts to brown continue to cook for 4 minutes stirring often.
- 2. Add ginger and curry powder and cook gently for 1 minute whilst stirring
- 3. Add the tomatoes and stock and bring to the boil
- 4. Lower the heat, add the salt and pepper and cover
- 5. Simmer gently for 35 minutes, stirring occasionally
- 6. Put n the carrots and simmer for 10 minutes
- 7. If using kale add this to the pan and continue to simmer for 10 minutes

- 8. If using spinach continue to simmer with carrots for another 7 minutes and then add the spinach and stir until it has wilted
- 9. Serve immediately

The soup is quite filling but if you have a good appetite serve with a warmed wholemeal roll or some toasted wholemeal pitta bread.

If soup is not required immediately, let it cool and keep in a fridge for up to 2 days and make sure when re-heating that it simmers for at least 3 minutes before serving.

Can be frozen. Defrost in the fridge and again make sure it is re-heated thoroughly before serving.


