

This is a really valuable way we can collectively as Churches show our love to the vulnerable people in our society – especially as we are not able to support them with our usual collection of tinned/packet food.





This charity works to provide hope and aid for the persecuted Church and operates in the same way that Barnabas and the apostle Paul did in the early church when they took gifts from the church in Antioch to the church in Judea at a time of famine.

Quite often in countries where Christians are persecuted for their faith, they are denied well paid jobs, education for their children and in places where aid is handed out in times of famine or natural disasters, very often Christians are not given any food or shelter. Barnabas Fund stands alongside our Christian brothers and sisters by providing aid through Christian partners (or churches where they are allowed). Money is given by Christians, and is sent through Christians to reach the Christians suffering deprivation, meeting their physical, practical and spiritual needs. This encourages, strengthens and enables the local church and Christian communities to carry on; knowing that their fellow Christians in free countries are praying and caring for them. The charity believes in the power of prayer to change people's lives and situations, either through Grace to endure or through deliverance from suffering and fulfilling the Bible verse from Matthew's Gospel chapter 25 v 40 - "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine, you did for me".

The charity also raises awareness regarding the plight of the persecuted Church, educating Christians and others about the current situation and needs. They also speak on behalf of those Christians who have no voice in their own land and the charity organize public petitions and letter writing campaigns or meeting contacts behind the scenes.

Some of the projects funded by Barnabas Fund are education of children, training support and funding for Christian leaders, help for setting up small

businesses, setting up young people in apprenticeships, provision of wells and water filter systems, relief for disaster victims, provision of Bibles or New Testaments, renovation or repairs of church buildings, medical aid and feeding programmes.

Although the charity has many offices across the world, the UK office is based locally in Coventry.
















Sharon's Recipe - MUTABBAQ RECIPE (SAUDI STREET STYLE PARTHA)

Ingredients For the Dough

160 grams all-purpose flour 1 tablespoon oil 1/4 teaspoon salt 120 millilitre lukewarm water

OR Spring roll sheets



Ingredients For the Minced Meat Filling

1 tablespoon oil

200 grams minced beef or substitute with chicken mince or mutton mince

1/2 tablespoon ginger garlic paste

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

1/2 teaspoon salt or to taste

1/2 teaspoon cumin powder

1/2 teaspoon red chilli powder

1/4 teaspoon turmeric powder

2 eggs

1 tomato roughly chopped

4 spring onions chopped

Instructions

For the Dough (If Using Spring Roll Wrappers Skip This Part)

- Add flour to the bowl of the stand mixer.
- Add the oil and salt, and mix.
- Now slowly start adding the water, about 1 tablespoon at a time and mix.
- Continue doing this (it will take about 3-4 minutes of kneading) until the dough starts leaving the sides of the bowl, and forms into a ball. You will not

need to add all of the water. If kneading by hand, it will take about 8-9 minutes.

If the dough is too sticky, add about 1/2 tablespoon of flour.

The dough should be smooth and soft, but not sticky.

Brush with a little bit of oil, cover, and rest for 30 minutes.

For the Minced Meat Filling

- In a frying pan, add the oil and meat. Cook for a minute
- Add the ginger garlic paste and spices. Cook for about 10 minutes or until the minced meat is browned and cooked.
- Add eggs to a mixing bowl, and add the cooked minced meat.
- Then add the tomato and green onions, and mix until incorporated.

For Making the Mutabbaq

- Divide the dough into 3 equal balls.
- Roll one ball into a rectangular shape (doesn't have to be perfectly shaped). The dough needs to be rolled so thin, that you can almost see through it. You can also gently use your fingers to stretch it a bit.
- Add the filling in a square shape on the rolled out dough.
- Fold from the sides, and then the bottom to make into a pocket. Make sure all sides are covered, and no filling is exposed.

OR

If using spring roll sheets, simply add the minced meat filling, and close from both sides. You will have to use a little bit of water to seal the pockets if using spring roll sheets.

Frying the Mutabbaq

- Heat oil in a frying pan, and add the mutabbaq bottom side down (the side that
 has the folds) and poke with a toothpick to help the steam escape. Keep heat
 level to medium high.
- Flip side when golden brown, and poke with toothpick again.

- When both sides are golden brown, brown the edges as well so that the dough cooks through from all sides.
- Remove from frying pan, and serve immediately.

Notes

Make sure to rest the dough for at least 30 minutes, or make it one night before and keep it in airtight container in the fridge. Take out when making the meat filling.

Cook on medium high heat so that the mutabbaq cooks well from the inside and crisps up too.

Mutabbaq can be stored in the fridge in an airtight container for up to 1-2 days. To reheat it, place in preheated oven on a baking tray for 15 minutes or so. It will heat up really well, but might not be as crispy as it is when fresh.


