Lent and Easter



Sadly, the Lent and Easter activities advertised in last month's magazine cannot take place but we should still commemorate these significant dates.

Palm Sunday - 5th April

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

Maundy Thursday _9th April

Maundy Thursday marks the night of the Last Supper. At the Last Supper, Jesus commanded that people should love one another. He then washed the feet of his disciples as an act of kindness.

Good Friday - 10th April

Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of Jesus and his death at Calvary.

Easter Day - Sunday 12th April

Easter Day commemorates the resurrection of Jesus from the dead, described in the New Testament as having occurred on the third day after his burial following his crucifixion.



Thank you to all who supported the World Day of Prayer – we raised about £200 for the charities that the WDOP support. It was so lovely to be able to worship together with each of our churches being represented.

It is sad that we cannot worship together at the moment (our Easter day on the Hayes is also suspended as we are not allowed to facilitate public worship) but we **can** still be united in prayer... so do let us continue to pray for one another.... for.... "How good and pleasant it is when brothers and sisters live together in unity...for there the LORD bestows his blessing, even life forevermore." (Psalm 133)







SAINTS PROJECT

This is one of the newest charities and also one of the most local of charities, being situated in Nuneaton. You may have seen many Saints flags flying around the former old Conservative Club building on the corner of Bond Gate/Newdegate Street. Older readers may remember visiting St. George's Hall, the lovely dance hall, for balls or wedding receptions many years ago and which, in later years became a nightclub. The building has now been transformed on the ground floor. A group of churches of different denominations and other Christian organizations came together with a vision for a place in Nuneaton; and led by the charity Together for Change Coventry and Warwickshire, who specialize in tackling poverty to bring positive change to their communities they searched for a suitable building. They signed for this building last summer and after a lot of hard work by volunteers opened their doors in January of this year.

There are many "zones" in the building. Enterprise and Equipping is one zone, where the aim is to tackle unemployment and lack of education by providing opportunities for people to start their own small business enterprise and to also equip people with skills for life.

Stalls can be hired here for your own creative enterprise or somewhere to shop for those who want to shop local and support local businesses.

Learning Zone offers space to host classes and courses. Maybe you have a skill to teach others and a room is available to hire for this purpose, or maybe you would like to learn something new such as making willow items, floral design or family art classes or to upgrade English and Maths. Business meetings can also be held here.

Cafe and Children's Play Space. There is a lovely free children's play area equipped with a variety of toys, books and a willow playhouse, where children can play while you relax in the adjacent cafe with a drink or lunch. The cafe is also available to book for an evening event. Free Wifi is also available for people to study or catch up on work whilst having a drink.

FairTrade also have a stall in the building, which is welcome news for those who used to buy fairly traded food, cards, gifts and cleaning products formerly at the Sycamore Tree, which sadly closed in 2016.

Sport and Support. There are plans in the future to use the upper floor to support people's physical, emotional and mental well being by offering sport activities and providing all age, family friendly exercise classes for the whole family; so keep an eye open for the opening of Phase 2.

Unfortunately, at the time of writing, like many other places, this building is now closed temporarily, due to the Coronavirus, but keep it in mind to visit for when it re-opens.

Sharon's Recipe - Hot Cross Buns (makes 12)

Preparation 1.5 hours plus rising, Cooking 25 minutes

Ingredients	Method			
	Sift 100 g / 4 oz flour into a bowl. Add 5ml / 1 tsp			
450g / 11b strong	of caster sugar			
plain flour	Blend fresh yeast with milk and water. If using




A short story from the Bible






