P <u>Prince of Peace</u> Isaiah 9 v 6"For to us a child is born, to us a son is given, and the government will be on his shoulders. He will be called Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace"

E <u>Emmanuel.</u> God with us. Isaiah 7 v 14 "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and will call him Emmanuel."

Hope is something that people long for in their lives. Let us this Advent share the Good News of Jesus. We can do this by reflecting God's love to those around us and by sharing the real meaning of Christmas in words as well as actions.

May I wish you and your family and friends a Happy and Blessed Christmas.

This charity was originally set up in 1854, but at that time was called The Turkish Missions Aid Society and was founded by a group of people including the Reformer Lord Shaftesbury. It changed its name a few times over the years and was latterly known as Biblelands until 2012. They have worked with and supported Christian communities doing life changing works in countries in the Middle East and are currently supporting projects in Israel, Palestine, Lebanon, Egypt and Syria. They help people of all faiths and none to help free themselves from a life of poverty and injustice and work with local Christians to bring lasting change to the Middle East through healthcare, education and community development projects. Their vision is to see lives and communities transformed by the compassion of Christ.

In 1954 the first Bethlehem Carol Sheet was produced and over 60 years later is still being used in many churches across the world. These carol sheets raise money to help children in the Holy Land. It won't be long now until we'll be singing carols once again and the carol sheets will be making their way out. As we sing "O Little Town of Bethlehem, how still we see thee lie" and "Peace on Earth, goodwill to men" let us spare a thought or a prayer for young children in Syria who have never known what it's like to live in a time of peace. Children like 6 year old Amir, a deaf boy who fled from Syria with his family, leaving behind everything to escape with their lives and now living in Lebanon.

As we celebrate the birth of our Saviour Jesus Christ, born in a stable, let us remember that He too didn't have an easy life and children in Bethlehem today still don't have it easy. Threat of conflict is never far away. Many

live in extreme poverty and for those who are disabled, life is even tougher. As Jesus and his parents fled from the jealous King Herod and took refuge in Egypt, families today are still fleeing from their homes, fearing for their lives.

EMBRACE are there for the refugees, trying to make things easier for the children in the camps, by providing education and some fun too. They also provide bursaries for children at 17 Christian schools in East Jerusalem, West Bank and Gaza giving other children who live in deep poverty the chance of an education. They also provide Life Schools for women who have received no education at all, teaching them a trade as well as how to read and write. They also help set up small businesses to enable people to help themselves to get out of poverty so that they are able to educate their own children. One lady was helped by providing her with an oven and a small amount of equipment to enable her to bake bread and pizzas which she sells from her house and she is now able to educate her children.

They also run Mercy Homes for badly disabled adults and children to live in and where they are loved and cared for and in some cases their physical health has improved as well as their mental and emotional health by being shown that they are worth something and not just being left on their own and regarded with very little value.

EMBRACE also provide healthcare support to a number of healthcare institutions across the Middle East and they also work in areas of Community development in very poor areas.

So, as we act out our Nativities or sing our carols from our hymn sheets let us also remember those whose lives are fraught with danger and whose lives are very different to our own.

# Sharon's Recipe - Hot Coronation Turkey – for those Christmas lunch leftovers


### **Ingredients**

1 onion, finely chopped 15g butter 15 ml / 1 tbsp curry powder 350g jar mango chutney 450g Greek-style yogurt 45ml / 3 tbsp mayonnaise 10ml/2 tsp tomato puree 450g **cooked** turkey meat, diced Cooked rice or pasta or baked potatoes to serve

### Method

- 1. Cook onion in butter until soft
- Stir in curry powder and cook, stirring, for 1 minute
- 3. Add chutney and heat through
- 4. Stir in yogurt, mayonnaise and tomato puree
- 5. Heat until almost boiling
- 6. Add turkey and cook gently for about 15 minutes or until heated through.
- 7. Serve with rice, pasta or baked potatoes




