Cross of Nails



You may well be aware of the story behind the Cross of Nails at Coventry Cathedral – but did you know they actively remember this theme daily in the Cathedral ruins when the Litany of Reconciliation is said at noon each week day?

Just like when the cross of nails was first put together from the smouldering ruins of the Cathedral following a war time air raid – the message wasn't 'Father forgive **them**' – but simply 'Father Forgive.' There was a recognition that the enemy wasn't simply just the 'other' but we too need to be forgiven and be reconciled to ourselves, one another and to God. The message then is about personal responsibility and not just blame shifting and the Litany (words) that are still used represent many different apects of life that we need to be conscious about in the day to day decisions we make.

The cross of nails has now become an international symbol of peace and reconciliation where peace is sought above revenge and unity valued above division. If you ever see the Archbishop of Canterbury on TV he is often wearing a cross of nails which is linked to his time of Ministry here in Coventry Diocese (including his curacy down the road at Coton!) We too have a small cross of nails inside church which we keep near the front of Church which serves as an important link for us to our Cathedral. But even more than that – the message of that cross is a challenge for us to forgive – just like the words that were said by Jesus on the cross – 'father forgive – for they don't know what they are doing'. Sometimes, sadly we do know what we are doing – but the good news is – that because of the cross, Jesus' death and resurection, and God's love for us - we too can know forgiveness. Let us then offer that forgiveness (that we all so desperately need) to one another. Father forgive....

CROSSLINKS

Crosslinks is an international missionary society working principally within the worldwide Anglican Community.

It was set up in October 1922 when a group of believers met "with sadness of heart" as they left an already established missionary society which had become rather liberal in its beliefs and practices; so they set up a new society which at first was known as the Bible Churchman's Missionary Society and later became Crosslinks. The "new" society will soon be celebrating its Centenary and has stayed true to the Bible's teaching as they take the Gospel all over the world.

Their prime focus is making Christ known through the proclamation and teaching of God's Word in the power of the Holy Spirit. They are enthusiasts for creative worldwide mission as they seek to take God's Word to God's world and seek to observe two fundamental priorities. They are:-

Evangelistic opportunities. They aim to recruit and deploy Christian disciples to reach the unreached across the world.

Training trainers. As it is the gospel that produces and sustains churches they aim to serve churches by nurturing competent, godly pastor teachers. They focus their efforts on training, equipping and resourcing those who can teach others.

Some of the first Crosslinks' missionaries were sent to diverse places such as China, India, Burma, Iran and the Arctic. The work then extended in Asia, into Africa, Europe and more recently to Australia and South America and they have proclaimed the gospel of salvation in over fifty countries.

When we think of missionaries we maybe think of people going out to places in Africa; but Crosslinks wants to make it possible for every Christian to get involved in mission. For some, this may mean long term mission work abroad, for others it may be helping at summer camps for children or young people in Europe and for others it may be short term placements which can be from 2 weeks to 2 years.


Mission isn't always about sending out missionaries from England to places abroad and Crosslinks support indigenous partners running projects in their own countries and trains Bible teachers and evangelists for this work.

Maybe you are interested in mission but are unable to go abroad to serve. You can still be involved in mission work as Crosslinks look for churches and individuals to pray for and maybe financially support a particular project or missionary. If you are able to go online, you can see the places where Crosslinks work, and "meet" some of the missionaries and their families and read their stories.





Sharon's Recipe - Baked Mushroom Risotto



Ingredients

1 lb Mushrooms (various kinds) sliced

4 tbsp Balsamic Vinegar

Salt and freshly ground pepper

1 medium onion peeled and chopped

1 tsp oil

1 vegetable stock cube dissolved in 1½ pints of water

2 cloves garlic chopped

12 oz Risotto rice

2 tbsp chopped parsley

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to 180°C / Gas Mark 4
- 2. Place the mushrooms in a roasting tin, drizzle over the balsamic vinegar and season. Roast in the oven for 20 minutes
- 3. Meanwhile warm the oil in a large frying pan and gently fry the onion for 10 minutes over a low heat
- 4. Meanwhile bring the stock cube and water to the boil in a saucepan
- 5. Add the Risotto rice and garlic to the onions and cook for 2 minutes, stirring
- 6. Pour in the stock and mix well
- 7. Add the Risotto mixture to the mushrooms in the roasting tin and combine well
- 8. Return to the oven for 20 minutes
- 9. Then check the Risotto every 5 minutes until it is cooked through and all the stock has been absorbed by the rice and the rice is soft and creamy
- 10. Remove from the oven, check the seasoning, stir in the parsley and serve




