

Lent

March is one of those months where we can look forward to new beginnings and good things to come. March is a month where we begin to see the days lengthening, the spring flowers budding and local birds and wildlife beginning to make preparations for family growth. On March 6th (Ash Wednesday) the Christian season of Lent begins – a period of forty days (plus Sundays) where Christians spend time reflecting and preparing for the joy of Easter Day, when Jesus rose from the dead in order that we all might have eternal life.

The number forty has Biblical significance in that the great flood of Noah's time saw forty days and nights of rain, the Israelites spent forty years wandering in the desert before arriving in the promised land, Moses fasted for forty days and nights before receiving the ten commandments and Jesus spent forty days and nights in the wilderness preparing for his ministry following his baptism.

Many Christians observe the forty days of lent, remembering Jesus' sacrificial time in the desert focussed on prayer and fasting, as a time of specifically seeking to grow closer to God by living in a more godly way. It can be a time of abstinence in which we give up something in order to give more of ourselves to God, or a time when we take on an additional something i.e. the "40 acts of generosity challenge" which inspires people to give and act generously and sacrificially throughout Lent.

This Lent season the communities of Holy Trinity, Hartshill and St Peter's, Galley Common will join together twice a week to hear about how lives are changed when people encounter Jesus. As the

Bible tells us, and many today will testify, it is impossible to meet Jesus and not be changed in some way or other. Perhaps this Lent, you might feel this is the time to encounter Jesus for yourself.

Our Lent gatherings are open to everyone, so please do consider coming along and joining us to meet with Jesus on Tuesday evenings in Hartshill and Thursday afternoons in Galley Common (check overleaf for dates and times). We'd love to see you there.

CHRISTIANS AGAINST POVERTY (CAP)

Founded in 1996 this is a relatively new charity started by John Kirkby of Bradford, who believed that God was calling him to sacrifice his career in finance and use his knowledge of the industry to help the poor.

His faith adventure led him to people crippled by debt; parents who couldn't feed their children; families facing eviction and desperate people living in fear and without hope. He used his expertise to negotiate with creditors, set up budgeting systems and offer a lifeline to those trapped in debt.

John himself had experienced debt in his earlier life, but with help from Christians he had his life transformed and became a born-again Christian himself. He has such a passion to help people who find themselves in a similar position to the one he had been in a few years earlier.

He started the charity at his kitchen table, with a small amount of money and a large amount of faith. He found a church to partner with and found passionate people to be trained as debt counsellors and he was reliant on the faith that God would provide. Four new CAP centres were open by the end of 1998.


Since then, CAP has rapidly grown its debt centre network throughout the UK and expanded its service to tackle the causes of debt and poverty too. It also helps people into employment through CAP Job Clubs and also a new service called CAP Life Skills to equip people to live well on a low income. Every CAP service is run through a local church, equipped and empowered to transform lives in their communities. Our local one is based at Manor Court Baptist church in Nuneaton.

Life in Britain today is very different to the one I knew, when jobs were plentiful and wages secure each week. There were no such things as zero hours contracts, where you may (or may not) have 2 days work, when 5 days work is needed to pay your mortgage or rent, household bills and food, and people can suddenly find themselves out of work, desperately trying to keep a roof over their families' heads, but not always managing to do so. A small loan to pay the mortgage for the next month can escalate, with interest, into unmanageable debt. CAP provide the help and advice to truly desperate people and many families are very grateful to CAP for rescuing them and giving them hope for the future.

A few years ago I had the privilege of attending a Christians Against Poverty evening event to raise money for the charity and as part of the evening a young lady spoke, giving her moving testimony of the help she had received from CAP. She finished by saying that she had become a Christian and was soon to be baptized. Very recently, by God's amazing timing and guidance, I had the opportunity to meet this lady again and hear her up to date story!

The History of Mothering Sunday

Mothering Sunday has evolved over the years; from the time when people would return to their “Mother Church” during Lent to when those in service and apprenticeships went home to their mothers with gifts such as hand-picked flowers.

By the early 20th century celebrating Mothering Sunday had waned in many places, but the institution of Mother's Day in the United States brought about renewed interest. This was a cause championed by Mothers' Union, amongst others. By 1938 it was claimed that Mothering Sunday was celebrated in every parish in Britain and in every country of the Empire. *Cordelia Moyse: A History of Mothers' Union; 2009*

Now a staple in the church calendar and celebrated on the fourth Sunday in Lent. Mothering Sunday is a time for us all to recognize the importance of those who have cared for and mothered us throughout our lives.

Here at Holy Trinity, Mothers' Union celebrate the role of Mothers and other carers in a child's life by presenting Daffodils at the Mothering Sunday service. We will also be selling cakes following the service in aid of the Mothers' Union “Make a Mother's Day” Appeal and so do, please, join us.

Sharon's Recipe – Pancakes

Note: Depending on choice of filling you may need to make / prepare filling in advance. **Makes 7-8**

<p>Ingredients Pancakes Butter for frying (2 – 4 oz) 4oz plain flour Pinch of salt 1 large egg 7 fl oz milk 3 fl oz water (If using semi skimmed milk use 10 fl oz and no water– for best results do not use skimmed milk)</p> <p>8” / 20 cm non-stick frying</p> <p>Suggested Ingredients for Filling / Serving Lemon juice and sprinkle of granulated sugar Chocolate melted in a bowl over a pan of simmering water then served with cream or ice-cream Mixed frozen berries, heated with a little sugar to make a sauce Maple syrup, walnuts and Greek Yogurt</p>	<p>Method</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Sieve the flour and salt together into a bowl2. Mix the water and milk together in a jug3. Make a well in the middle of the flour and add the egg4. With a wooden spoon, stir the egg in the middle and collect the flour from around the well and as the well gets larger stir wider until you have incorporated as much flour as you can then add a little of the milk mixture and continue to beat and gradually add the milk and water mix until all the ingredients are mixed well together.5. Continue to beat with a balloon whisk or electric mixer and beat until you have a thin bubbly mixture.6. Let it rest for 20 minutes (optional)7. When ready to cook, place the frying pan over a medium to high heat on the hob and melt a knob of butter in it and move the pan about so that the butter coats all the base of the frying pan8. When the butter starts to bubble use a ladle to measure and pour some of the pancake mixture into the pan and move the pan around so that pancake spreads out – cook on a medium heat, lifting the edges of the pancake with a non-stick spatula, when it firms up a bit, jiggle the pan gently until the pancake moves about and does not stick anywhere9. Toss the pancake to cook the other side – this takes about 1 minute and again the pancake will move freely once cooked, if you

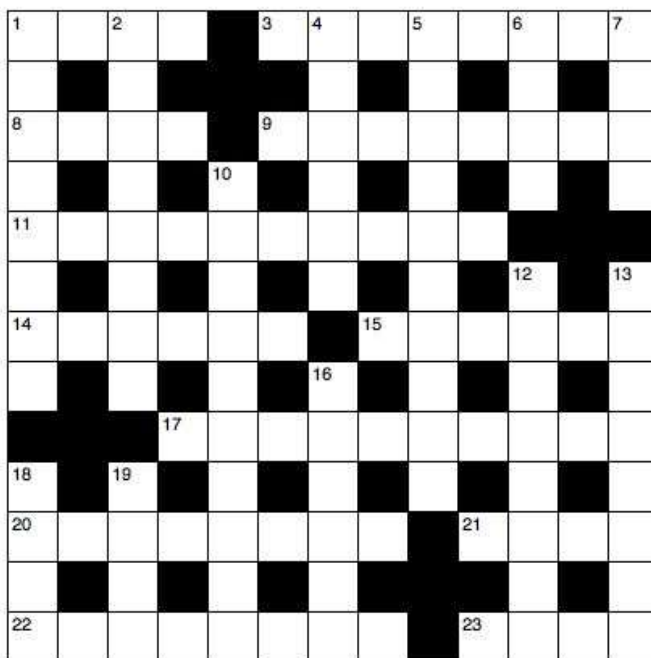
like them a bit crispy keep in the pan for a little longer.

10. Turn out the pancake onto a plate and fill with your favourite sweet ingredients or sauces or use one of the suggested fillings and enjoy.

Shrove Tuesday is the last day before Lent which starts on Ash Wednesday when traditionally there has been a fast. The idea is that you use up all the perishable ingredients in your cupboards on your pancakes so that they are not wasted, so the fillings can be just about anything you have to hand.

In 2019 Shrove Tuesday is on 5th March

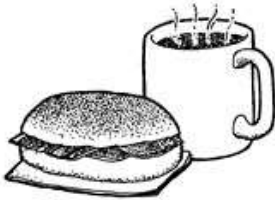
