May Letter

Dear friends

What changes we have seen in our lives and how we live over the last few weeks. We could be tempted to ask 'when will it all end and will things ever be the same again?'. If we dwell on these thoughts, our lives can become empty, meaningless and without hope.

But we have hope if we trust and rely on the one who is always there for us and who never changes. If we look at our Bibles, Hebrews 13:8 tells us 'Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever'.

Why is this significant? Matthew 6: 25 - 34 says:

²⁵ "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body, what you will wear. Is not life more than food, and the body more than clothes? ²⁶ Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? ²⁷ Can any one of you by worrying add a single hour to your life^[a]?

²⁸ "And why do you worry about clothes? See how the flowers of the field grow. They do not labour or spin. ²⁹ Yet I tell you that not even Solomon in all his splendour was dressed like one of these. ³⁰ If that is how God clothes the grass of the field, which is here today and tomorrow is thrown into the fire, will he not much more clothe you—you of little faith? ³¹ So do not

worry, saying, 'What shall we eat?' or 'What shall we drink?' or 'What shall we wear?' ³² For the pagans run after all these things, and your heavenly Father knows that you need them. ³³ But seek first his kingdom and his righteousness, and all these things will be given to you as well. ³⁴ Therefore do not worry about tomorrow, for tomorrow will worry about itself. Each day has enough trouble of its own.

WE ARE LOVED! - throughout the Bible, God's unchanging and unfailing love for us is revealed. Psalm 36:7 says 'How precious is Your unfailing love, O Lord. People take refuge in the shadow of Your wings'.

Despite everything we are going through, nothing can separate us from God's love. If we look at Romans 8: 38' - 39:

³⁸ For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons,^[a] neither the present nor the future, nor any powers,
³⁹ neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord'.

THROUGH FAITH MISSIONS (TFM)

This mission was founded in 1985 by Rev. Daniel Cozens, although it didn't become a charity until 1991. Daniel had been working as an evangelist for quite a few years, mainly in the Anglican church, but felt called by God to serve all communities by sharing the Gospel of Christ and his vision was to work outside of the church building to reach those who don't normally come to church.

He began to speak in pubs, clubs, homes and the open-air and was joined in this task by Rev. Peter Adams. In 1991 Daniel had a particular vision to plan a 3 week mission down the Pennine Way. Over 600 men and a few women joined this mission and were organized into teams. The impact was immense with many people coming to know Christ. This became the first "Walk of 1,000 Men" and this was the main focus of Through Faith Missions from then on. Since that first walk there have been 18 walks through different counties of the UK. Over 4,000 men and women have participated in the missions in various ways, from visits to single churches, to villages and towns, up to whole counties or regions. Each year TFM is involved in numerous events in the UK, along with annual missions in Africa.

Quite a few years ago, Holy Trinity had a visit by a group of these men for a weekend, talking to us and training us in simple evangelism and joining in the Sunday service giving testimonies. It was an inspiring weekend and helped us take the Gospel of Jesus Christ out of the church and onto the streets of Hartshill, which led to prayer walking of the whole village and other outreach events. TFM partner with local churches who are hoping to do outreach in their communities and have visited hundreds of churches over the last 30 years. Although the mission started with an Anglican, the volunteers now come from different denominations and Christian backgrounds but who have a common aim in wishing to make Jesus known to everyone.

As I write this, we are still in lockdown; so many of TFM's missions have been postponed or cancelled this year. Walking the Pennine Way or any other county is not possible at present. However, the need for people to hear the Gospel of Jesus Christ is great at this time of uncertainty and worry. Evangelism isn't just about reaching huge numbers of people in stadiums or football grounds as the great evangelists like Billy Graham have done, or walking the length of the Pennine Way as Walk of 1,000 Men have done - it can be done on a one-to-one basis. We may be restricted in who we can see at present; but as we contact our family, friends, work colleagues by phone, or any number of methods in modern technology (a lot of which are a bit beyond me!), we can simply tell our stories of what Jesus has done for us and is doing at this very difficult time in our lives. Jesus - a Light in the darkness.

Sharon's Recipe - Really Easy Cup Cakes - Makes 12 to 18

To help get us through social distancing a nice easy recipe that the children will enjoy making with the help of an adult.



Ingredients Cakes	Method	
4oz Stork SB	1. Preheat oven to gas mark 4/180	
margarine at room	degrees C/ 350 degrees F. Place 12	
temperature	muffin cases or 18 fairy cake cases in

White Chocolate and Raspberry

2oz white chocolate chips 12-18 Fresh raspberries <u>Cherry and</u> <u>Coconut</u>

1oz dessicated coconut 2oz glace cherries washed, dried and chopped into quarters

Ingredients Topping

4oz icing sugar 1-2 tbsp water, lemon juice, or orange juice depending on which flavour you are making. Sprinkles (any colour and design you like)

7. FOR THE WHITE CHOCOLATE AND RASPBERRY ONLY, PUSH ONE RASPBERRY INTO THE MIDDLE OF EACH CAKE WITH THE HANDLE END OF A TEASPOON AND GENTLY REPLACE CAKE MIXTURE OVER THE TOP.

- 8. Bake for 20 minutes
- 9. Leave to cool on wire rack

Method Topping

When the cakes are cool, mix the icing sugar with water (only adding a little at a time as the amount needed varies and 2 tablespoons may be too much) or mix lemon juice or orange juice depending on which flavour you want to have to match the cakes. Again, mix gently and add the liquid slowly to make sure it's not too runny.


When it's thick but runny, put a spoonful on each cake. It should naturally spread out a bit.

Finish by gently sprinkling coloured sprinkles over the icing before it dries




